The circle is so universally omnipresent that it has been said to have preceded recorded human history. As container and conveyor, it serves so many physical and metaphysical purposes across human existence and culture it is impossible to imagine life without them. Its structural integrity prescribes an equanimity and strength that is impervious, as its form is shared all throughout nature and the built environment.

The artists here use the circle in various and roundabout ways. Tracing the circumference, the circle alludes to an island of measured territory and expressive field within, a preservation of personal terrain.

The exhibition features works in diverse media such as drawing, painting, mixed media, installation, light sculpture, and video from a group of mid-career artists. Four of the five artists are not originally from the US, and that is reflected in their use of the circle.
